Wednesday 14th

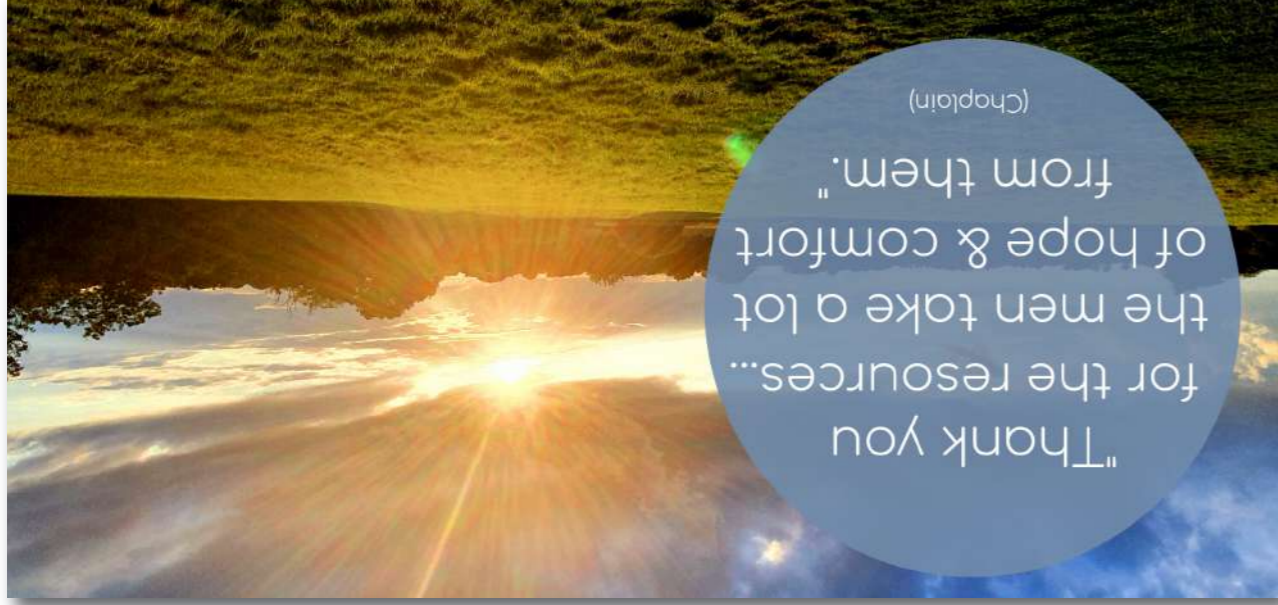
Today, please pray for our letter writing ministry: for each of the prisoners who use it and for our volunteers who write to them.

I also find it very lonely as well, because the minute you start talking about God, others walk away and say, "He's nuts", or "weird";
