

We continue to be thankful for opportunities to run regular Bible studies in prisons and have been particularly encouraged by an opening to start a new study group recently. Taking place on a wing in a prison where we already carry out chaplaincy work, we have begun to work through John's Gospel, and it is good to already have a core group of men who are keen to come along week by week.

Jordan, one of the men who has been attending regularly is not a believer but is showing a real interest. It has been wonderful to see him taking notes, going away and doing further reading on his own, and then coming back prepared for the next session.

While running a Sunday service recently, one of our team was also pleased to see Peter who he had first met while carrying out chaplaincy work at another prison. Peter never used to show any interest in Christianity but shared that he did used to think about the conversations he had with our chaplain and read the literature he was given.

Since moving to his new prison, Peter had been invited to a Sunday service by a fellow prisoner and thought he would give it a go. It was encouraging to hear that he now goes along to services every week, as well as attending Bible studies.

Please pray that as Jordan, Peter, and many other prisoners come along to services and Bible studies week by week, the Lord will use these activities to show them their need of Christ.
