Over the last month, we have continued to see encouragements from our Bible study groups. It has been a joy to have a number of new prisoners coming along to these with good questions and a real enthusiasm for learning more from God's Word.

The study group that recently started in HMP Deerbolt are currently using John Blanchard's *Ultimate Questions* as the basis for their studies, and at their latest session, they discussed the question *What is God like?* It was encouraging to see how much the young men engaged with the subject, asking if they could continue looking at the character of God in future weeks. We pray that what they learn in these studies will stay with them, and that the Lord will use this in their hearts and lives.

We have also been encouraged by letters received from prisoners in recent weeks. One man, Alfie, who we have regular contact with, has recently been affected by the death of a younger prisoner on his wing who he had befriended. After hearing the news of his friend, we were able to write to him, pointing him to Psalm 23, and to Jesus as the Shepherd who is with us, even in the darkest times, and also enclosed the latest of our written messages.

It was lovely to receive a reply from Alfie, letting us know that this had arrived just at the right time. He writes, "I've just been in my prayer hour and the last words I prayed were for good news in the mail to strengthen and lift me up, and then the Daylight Bible sheet and your letter came through the steel! Thank you, for tonight, you've been God's servant and lifted me right back up!". Please pray that contact from Daylight will continue to be an encouragement to him.

Luke – Give thanks for Luke, who is delighted to be able to read the Bible in Romanian, his first language. Please pray that the Lord will speak to him through His Word.

HMP Wayland (Norfolk) – Due to a member of the chaplaincy team cutting back on their hours, we have been asked to cover a lot more Sunday services recently. Give thanks for these opportunities and please pray that the messages preached will be used in the hearts and lives of the men who attend.

Please pray for P who recently asked for a Bible. He has started to read it, but has a lot of baggage to overcome which is unhelpfully shaping his thinking at the moment.
