## Daylight Newsletter June 2023

We give thanks that recent opportunities to run Sunday services have been encouraging. Prisoners have been listening attentively and engaging well and there have also been good openings for conversations afterwards.

After a recent service in which we had been thinking about Jesus as the Good Shepherd, it was particularly good to speak to one young man, John. He had a well-used Bible and bought it over to one of our team, asking if it was okay that he had been highlighting sections to come back to so he could take time to think over and meditate on them.

John had many good questions about passages he had been reading, but was concerned that he did not always understand things at first. He shared that his favourite book of the Bible was Genesis, and that he had been particularly enjoying reading the chapters on the life of Abraham and his family, listing various things he had learnt and saying he was keen to share the story with his son. We pray that John will continue to read his Bible and that as we encouraged him to, he will ask the Lord for help in understanding it.

It has also been good recently to come across Christian prisoners who are keen to witness to others. One of our volunteers carrying out chaplaincy work was encouraged by a conversation with J, who had become interested in the Gospel following a conversation with a Christian cell mate, and another of our team was delighted to meet Owen who is enthusiastically sharing the Gospel with others on his wing.

Please pray that those in prisons who are Christians will continue to grow in their knowledge of Christ, and that they will be helped as they seek to share their faith in what can often be a challenging environment.

## June Prayer Points

**HMP Bullingdon (Oxfordshire)** – Give thanks for around fifteen men attending the monthly Bible studies here, with some always ready to ask questions about salvation and issues arising from the passages. Please pray that the men will understand the need for personal repentance and trusting in the Saviour for themselves.

**Content Hub** – Give thanks for a growing new opportunity with a Content Hub having been successfully trialled at one prison where we work regularly, and now being rolled out across the country. This new technology enables prisoners to access a closed internal server with useful content, and in the trial prison, this has included a Christian section with teaching materials, worship music, and Daylight's written messages. Please pray that we will be given wisdom in knowing how best to make use of this.

**HMP Portland (Dorset)** – Give thanks for the privilege of being part of people's journeys, particularly two men whose time in prison seems to be really making them think about their lives and God. They seem to have genuine faith, and yearn for the times of Bible study, especially as we zoom out to see the big picture.

**Richard** – Please pray for Richard, a Christian ex-offender we have had contact with for many years, that he will be encouraged and strengthened in his walk with the Lord, and for a local church to be found that will welcome and support him.

**Rob** – Please pray for Rob, a prisoner who lost his wife and daughter in a car accident involving a drunk driver, and has substance abuse problems as a result of trying to escape the pain of his loss. He is a nominal Christian but has little real understanding of what that means, so pray that contact with one of our chaplains will be used to speak to him.

**Solent Prayer & Support Group** – Give thanks for the opportunity the team had to share the Gospel at a service in HMP Ford last month and for further dates for services there this year. Please pray that opportunities would also open up at another nearby prison.

**Steven St John** – It is impossible to convey all that Steven has done during his ten years as Daylight's Chief Executive, but please join us in giving thanks for the way God has used him in this role, and pray that he will be blessed and a blessing in his ongoing work in prisons and elsewhere.

A number of the group were unable to attend due to ill health, but the prayer time was a real blessing. Please pray for travelling mercies in several trips to West Yorkshire, Durham, and the Midlands over coming weeks.

**HMP Wayland (Norfolk)** – Give thanks that the weekly Bible studies are now back up and running and for the opportunity for a team from Great Ellingham Baptist Church to run a service here once a month.
