## Sunday 8th

Give thanks that we continue to be invited to run Sunday services in prisons. These services give good opportunities for opening up God's Word with large groups of prisoners, as well as reaching prison staff. It is encouraging to see prisoners listening attentively, and to have the opportunity to speak with them afterwards, discussing Bible passages they have been reading during the week, as well as praying with them over specific concerns they are facing, such as the health of family members or upcoming court cases.



Monday 9th

Please pray for Daylight people carrying out chaplaincy work, as they spend time with individual prisoners on the wings, answering questions, befriending, and offering support to those who are particularly struggling, including those who have recently lost loved ones.



Tuesday 10th

Give thanks that we have the opportunity to supply prisons with regular written messages and for continued encouraging responses to these. Along with seasonal topics, this year, these have largely focused on the lives of Joseph and Moses.

Please pray that as prisoners learn about these Old Testament characters, they will be able to see the relevance of these passages to their lives today, and will be encouraged to read more of God's Word for themselves.

Wednesday 11th

Today, please pray for those who have become Christians during their time in prison, and are now being released, rebuilding their lives outside, and will be welcomed and supported by local church fellowships.



Give thanks for the work of The Welcome Directory in training churches and for the support the Community Chaplaincy Association provide to prison leavers.

Thursday 12th



Give thanks that we are able to share the Gospel through Bible studies and courses such as Christianity Explored & Hope Explored.

It has been wonderful to have prisoners attending these who are eager to learn and to participate in discussions, and to see them going away with a greater knowledge of Christ and who He is. Please pray that this will not just be head knowledge but something that brings real and lasting change to their hearts.
